Welcome to Tettenhall College

Founded in 1863 by a local industrialist, Tettenhall College is an independent, co-educational day and boarding school providing continuous, quality education for children aged from 2 to 18 years. The School currently has around 500 pupils, the majority of whom are drawn from across the Midlands, but also includes a vibrant boarding community made up of pupils from over 25 countries worldwide.

The School stands in 30 acres of stunning grounds and woodland situated in the picturesque village of Tettenhall, on the outskirts of the city of Wolverhampton.

Our pupils are known for their positive approach, their appreciation of the staff, of their School and of their fellow pupils, their motivation to learn and their whole-hearted commitment to every aspect of school life. Tettenhall College, in turn, is committed to providing an outstanding personalised education, combining strong academic standards and a wide range of extra-curricular activities.

Academic results are consistently high. Pupils achieve very good GCSE and A Levels. The vast majority of Sixth Form leavers choose to go on to university with many selecting Russell Group institutions and a few each year opting for prestigious international options or competitive, sought-after apprenticeships with major companies. Beyond the classroom, pupils have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of sporting, performance and co-curricular activities, as well as being encouraged to engage in adventure and charitable causes.

The School is an active member of the Society of Heads, the Independent Schools Association and the Boarding Schools Association.

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Working with us

The School combines the best of modern teaching and facilities with the heritage and values of a traditional educational establishment – both in its physical setting and in its ethos. A substantial, recently completed investment programme has created outstanding facilities for the next era of Tettenhall College: modern en-suite study-bedrooms, a state of the art Study Centre, a new Sixth Form Common Room, a library, a multi-purpose all-weather sports facility and squash courts. These investments complement the already impressive facilities of the Victorian 'Towers Theatre'; a charming Victorian indoor heated swimming pool; extensive sports fields and modern IT facilities. A high grade investment in the School's largest boarding house is currently underway.

This commitment to providing the very best facilities is matched by the energy and passion of our inspirational, committed staff who strive to inspire and ensure that all pupils fulfil their personal best. Small class sizes throughout the School ensure individual attention for each pupil with emphasis on the development of the individual. This supportive environment has resulted in the School's excellent reputation for pastoral care – confirmed by a recently awarded Well-Being Award. Support of those pupils who have additional learning needs, including EAL, is a critical element of the School's offering.

This is an exciting time to join Tettenhall College; the leadership team are committed to continuing to increase the School's profile both locally and within overseas markets. Pupil numbers have grown by 25% with a steady increase in boarding. Tettenhall College is now widely recognised as one of the Midlands' leading independent schools and is progressing rapidly towards its goal of becoming one of the best small independent schools in the UK.

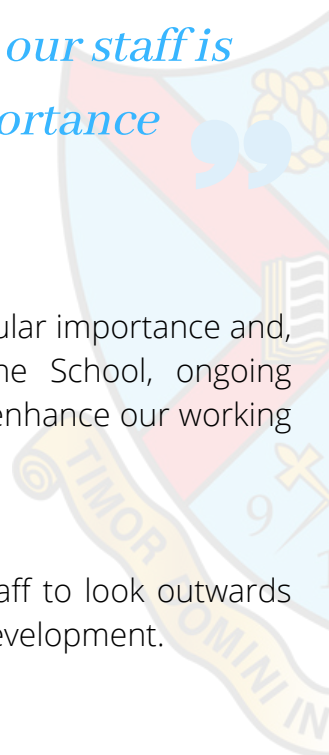


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The well-being of all our staff is of particular importance and, as part of an overall strategy for the School, ongoing initiatives are continually introduced to enhance our working environment.

The Sport and Physical Education Department

The Sport and PE Department at Tettenhall College invites applications for the position of Resident Sports & Boarding Graduate for a September 2026 start. This position offers an opportunity for an energetic person to work directly with the Director of Sport.

Sport is an integral aspect of student life at Tettenhall College, with a rich tradition of excellence and a substantial number of students participating in our diverse sporting programmes. Our aim is to make a meaningful and lasting impact on all students through sports, fostering their development into outstanding individuals. As part of our commitment to achieving excellence in both performance and engagement, we are making significant investments in Sport, with the exploration of a strength and conditioning unit and full size astro turf.

Whilst proud of our diverse sporting heritage, we are forward-facing, seeking to cultivate a dynamic and progressive approach to sports. Core sports such as rugby, hockey, netball, football, cricket, and swimming form the foundation, complemented by a broad-ranging sports curriculum. Students can represent the college in over twenty sports, spanning from Ultimate Frisbee and dance to skiing or horse riding. The rapidly growing enrichment sport programme aims to provide diverse opportunities, facilitating every student's exploration of sporting interests.

All students engage in a Games afternoon each week, with team practices scheduled before and after the school day, as well as during lunchtimes. Our sports department, comprised of specialist sports teachers, external coaches, and teachers of other academic subjects, supports the sports programme. The sports facilities are distributed around the main college site, but we do utilise several other local facilities to enhance our provisions. The main site features a sports hall with indoor cricket nets, floodlit netball courts, indoor swimming pool, floodlit all-weather Astro turf pitch, rugby and football pitches, cricket pitches, cross country trails and orienteering.

Sports is taught alongside academic PE throughout the school from year 1 upwards. Pupils can continue studying PE at GCSE (Edexcel) and A-level (OCR).



Boarding Duties & Responsibilities

- Share the responsibility for the health and safety, well-being and safeguarding of all pupils.
- Promote high standards of punctuality, behaviour and good manners with all pupils, taking appropriate action where necessary.
- Be fully aware of Tettenhall College's policies and procedures relating to the behaviour of, and safeguarding of, young people and act in accordance with these.
- Available at the beginning of term to meet and greet boarders and their parents/guardians.
- Available at the end of term to enable the fluid process of boarders leaving for holidays: meeting of taxis, parents or guardians and the monitoring and clearing of each house.
- Contribute to the boarding house duty rota as required by the Housemaster/ Housemistress.
- When on duty, supervise boarders by being a visible presence in the House. Ensuring that the House is maintained as an orderly and well-disciplined community and that the House rules are followed.
- Carry out all House routines and registers as specified by the Housemaster/ Housemistress.
- Resident during duty days and weekends.
- Attend all meals and be available via the House duty mobile phone at all times on duty days.
- Play an active role in the supervision of prep. Offering where possible, advice on organisation, approach to written work, management of workload and other appropriate study skills.
- Mentor a group of boarders academically. This includes identifying the need for support where necessary and reporting all academic concerns to the Housemaster/ Housemistress.
- Ensure that any incidents or communications from parents are logged and reported to the Housemaster/ Housemistress.
- Liaise with the Housemaster/ Housemistress over pastoral, disciplinary, maintenance or health and safety matters.
- Communicate openly and regularly with parents/ guardians of the boarders having consulted or informed the Housemaster/ Housemistress if circumstances allow.
- Liaise with the School Nurses on boarder health issues and issues medication following boarding procedures.
- Attend and assist with House activities and trips as required by the Housemaster/ Housemistress.
- Attend and contribute to meetings as required.
- Contribute to the marketing and promotion of the College.
- Attend INSET as required for the better performance of their boarding duties.
- Ensure that national minimum standards for boarding schools are applied consistently.
- Provide excellent pastoral care through effective communication with boarding pupils and teamwork with colleagues.
- Promote a culture within the House that provides a vibrant living environment that promotes security and brings out the best in every pupil.
- Engage fully with professional development opportunities within the House.

Sports Responsibilities

- Assist with the teaching of core Physical Education and Curriculum Games.
- Attend PE department meetings.
- Assist with coaching various sports teams and PE lessons.
- Supervise sports practices, events and fixtures (including some Saturday fixtures).
- Provide support during training sessions and matches.
- Assist with the maintenance of sports equipment and facilities.
- Support the development and implementation of training programmes.
- Assist with supervision of students during physical education classes and extracurricular activities from reception through to sixth form.
- Assist with administrative tasks related to sports programmes, such as scheduling and communication with parents.
- Contribute to the promotion of sports and physical activity within the school community.
- Collaborate with other staff members to ensure the smooth operation of sports-related activities.

Duty Requirements

- Four evening boarding duties per week.
- One weekend boarding duty in three.
- 14 to 16 hours per week in the sports department of the day school.
- Some Saturday fixture duties required.

Person Specification

- Educated to degree level with a suitable sporting qualification.
- Have relevant experience/qualifications in playing and coaching a number of sports.
- Caring, positive and reliable with a good sense of humour.
- Experience of working with, teaching, coaching or supporting young people.
- Enthusiasm and willingness to get involved in the life of a vibrant Boarding School.
- Flexibility, stamina and adaptability, with a willingness to undertake extra duties when required.
- Ability to work with initiative and with others as part of a team.
- Competent in the use of ICT.
- An excellent role model for young people.
- Demonstrate excellent communication skills to ensure that family members feel that they are connected to the House community and receive outstanding levels of customer service.
- Ability to foster a vibrant learning environment, motivating pupils to pursue their personal best.
