An Introduction to Our School

Welcome to Tettenhall College, a beautiful and historic boarding school in the heart of England. This school is located in Tettenhall, which is a pretty, safe and affluent village, close to the major city of Birmingham. Tettenhall College has approximately 500 students. In the senior school, around one third of students are full boarders (100) who come from 25+ different countries, including of course the UK. Academic standards are high, and each year students progress to some of the most popular and highly regarded universities, both in the UK and internationally.

Study Opportunities at TC

Tettenhall College offers a clear pathway to academic success. International students are able to join at the correct grade for their age, and can expect a full and authentic integration with a majority British school population.

The school follows the British curriculum, and the majority of students go on to excellent university destinations.

One-Year iGCSE Programme

For pupils aged 15-16 years of age. Prepares students for the beginning of their Sixth Form journey. Pupils take 5-6 iGCSEs in one year only. A strong academic programme but with a time and economic benefit.

Years 7-9: Preparation for GCSEs

Pupils aged 11 - 14 years follow a broad and balanced British curriculum designed to build strong academic foundations, helping to prepare for GCSEs and A Levels. It offers a full integration and a superb language immersion.

Two-Year GCSE Programme

For pupils aged 14-16. Pupils take a range of core and optional subjects over a two-year period and typically achieve 9 GCSEs before progressing to Sixth Form.

Two-Year A Level Programme

For pupils aged 16-18 years of age. Students specialise in 3 or 4 subjects. Students select subjects that align with their intended university course or future career aspirations.

Pre-University Integration Year/ One Year A Level

For students aged 16 - 18. This is a 30 - 36 week IELTS skill development and examination preparation programme. It is an opportunity for students to experience an authentic academic integration in a British School, with students who are preparing to sit A Levels and then progress to university.

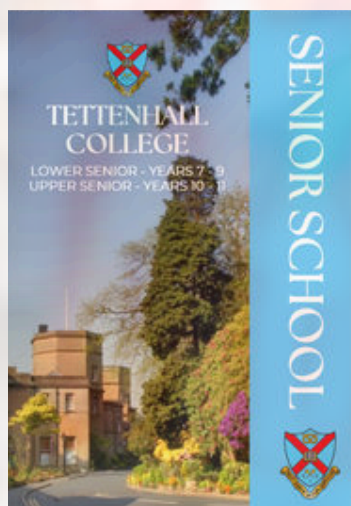

Year 7-9: Pre-GCSE Preparation



In Senior School our pupils follow a broad and balanced British curriculum, providing them with the skills and knowledge base to take them to the next stage of their academic studies – GCSE and A Level qualifications.

As well as a strong emphasis on the core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science we consider languages to be important and so offer French and Spanish within our core timetable (although many international students may take additional English language classes). Creativity abounds in our Art, Music and Drama programmes, and History and Geography lessons teach pupils about our world, both past and present.

Computing offers exciting possibilities to understand and control new technologies.

Physical Education and Games encourage health and fitness, as well as providing opportunities to acquire and develop skills and attitudes to individual endeavour and teamwork. Add to the mix the moral and ethical dimensions discussed in PSHE and Religious Education and you have an academic programme that is broad and balanced, enjoyable and intellectually demanding. English as an Additional Language (EAL) is offered as a specialist subject throughout Senior School.

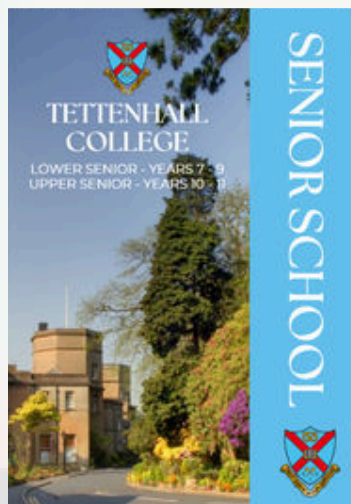

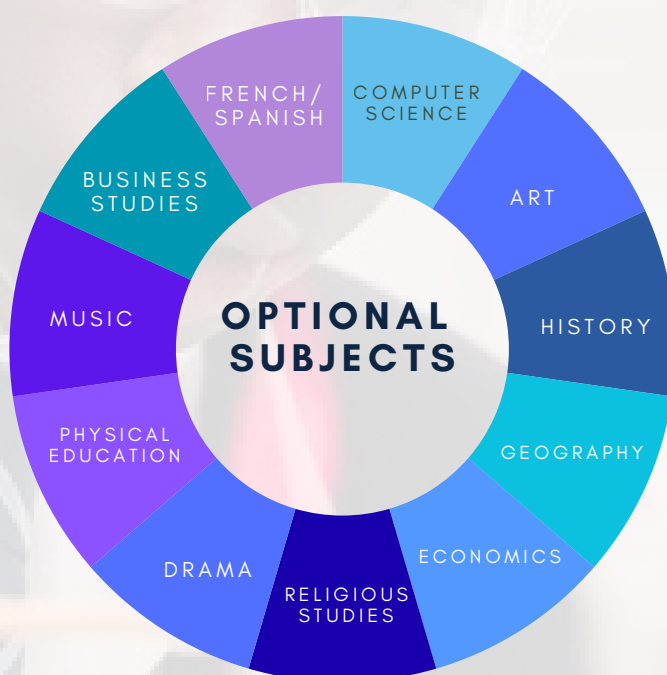
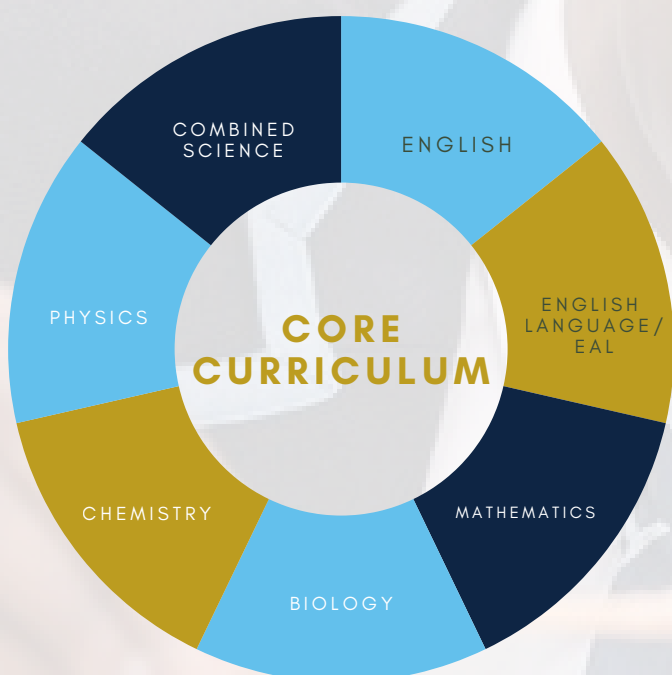

Year 10–11: Two-year GCSE Programme



The GCSE programme is a two-year course of study for students aged 14–16 and represents a key stage in the British education system. Here's what you need to know:

- Pupils follow a core curriculum in addition to studying one language and choosing 3 or 4 subject options. A total of 9 subjects are studied.
- The academic work in Years 10 and 11 is balanced by a programme of games, PSHE and extra-curricular activities during the extended school day and throughout the week.



At Tettenhall College, we believe that the foundation for success lies in the wellbeing of our pupils. We are deeply committed to creating a nurturing environment where health and happiness are prioritised, enabling our senior school pupils to reach their full potential. By fostering a supportive culture that values individual needs, we ensure that every pupil can thrive academically and develop into confident, compassionate global citizens.

Our supportive environment is designed to nurture both the mental and physical wellbeing of every pupil. We recognise that the senior school years can be both exciting and demanding, as pupils prepare for to sit formal examinations and navigate growth and change. To ensure their success, we provide a robust network of care through our dedicated pastoral team, form tutors, and access to wellbeing, health and counselling services.

We actively promote a culture of openness, encouraging pupils to discuss any challenges they face, whether academic, personal, or social. Our PHSE provision was specifically praised in our most recent ISI inspection, allowing pupils opportunities to consider topics such as managing stress, building resilience, and maintaining a healthy work-life balance.

The One-Year iGCSE Programme



The Tettenhall College one-year iGCSE programme has been carefully designed to ensure international students aged 15 – 16 years of age, or British students who are returning to the UK education system having previously studied in an international school, have the very best preparation possible, prior to beginning their Sixth Form academic journey.

GCSEs are usually taken over two years, but the Tettenhall College one-year iGCSE programme allows students to take five or six iGCSEs in one year only. This means in one year they will achieve the minimum entry requirements necessary to go on to study A Levels, ahead of making their applications to university.

This programme is ideal for international students who are motivated to experience a strong academic environment, with individual support from highly experienced subject specialist teachers, or British students who are returning to the UK education system having previously studied in an international school. Due to the nature of the programme, we require a minimum B2 level of English language, or equivalent.

The core subjects for GCSE

On the course, students will study:

- Maths IGCSE
- English Language iGCSE or ESL (English as a Second Language) IGCSE
- Double Award Science IGCSE (2 iGCSEs awarded)
- GCSE in pupil's native language

**Subjects are offered when there is sufficient demand and changes to this may occur.*

Students will also participate in sports classes along with Personal & Social Education on their weekly schedule. Those students who wish to take individual musical instrument or vocal lessons, will be able to include this as an optional extra during the weekly schedule. In order to fully immerse our international students within our mainstream classes, they will also attend a number of additional academic classes, however these are not subjects which will be examined at the end of the year.

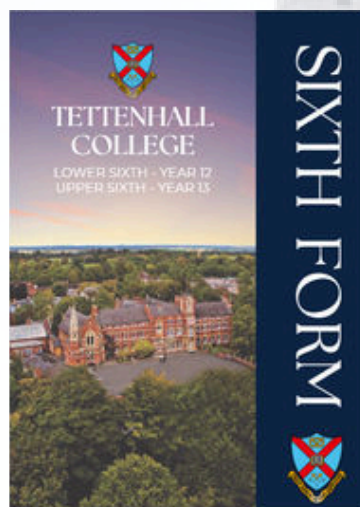
Weekends

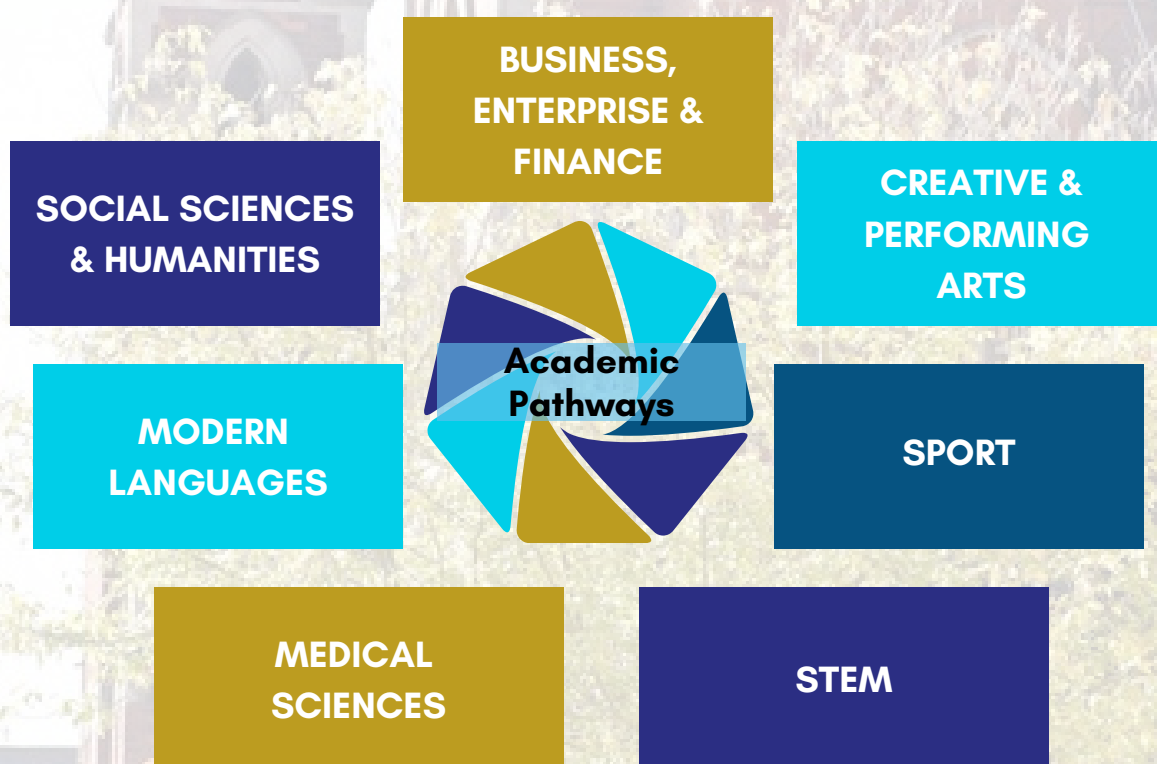


Two-Year A Level Programme



A Level study is designed to be a two-year course of study for students aged 16 – 18 years of age. Students choose three or four curriculum options from a choice of over 18 subjects. Each pathway is designed to ensure that Sixth Form students wanting to progress on to a specific career path, are given opportunities to:

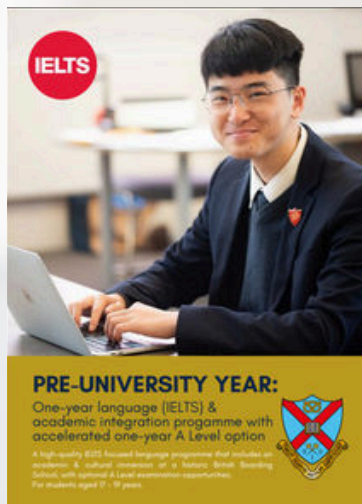
- Enhance – their subject knowledge for their career pathway.

The aim for each pathway is to ensure that each student is best prepared to go on to study or work in the field of their choice.

One-Year Pre-University Programme



The one-year Pre-University programme is a 30 – 36 week IELTS skill development and examination preparation programme. It is also an opportunity for students to experience an authentic and meaningful academic integration in a British School, with students who are preparing to sit A Levels and then progress to university.

WHO IS IT FOR? Students from China who have completed their Gaokao examinations, typically aged 16 – 18 years old Students who would benefit from an intensive, British environment English language immersion Students who are considering applying to a UK, European or USA university Ambitious, engaged students who are seeking a cultural immersion that delivers strong communication development and life skills.

WHAT DOES IT INCLUDE? An intensive IELTS preparation year. This includes exam practice, early entry, main entry and re-sit opportunities, if required. If a student is at a high enough standard in one or more of the following subjects, they will be entered for the A Level examination, at the end of the year (up to 3 subjects, typically):

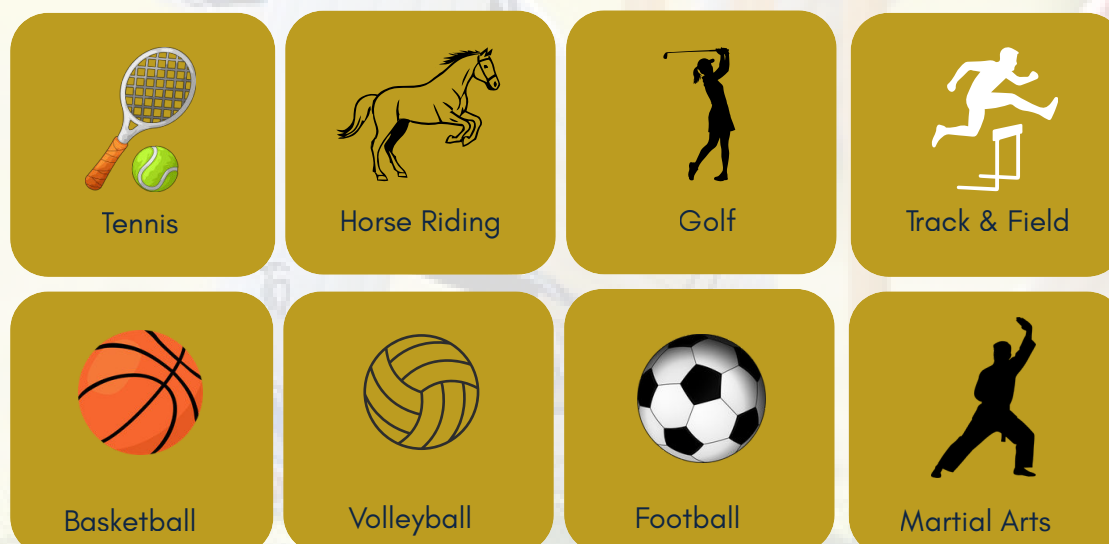
Sport at Tettenhall College

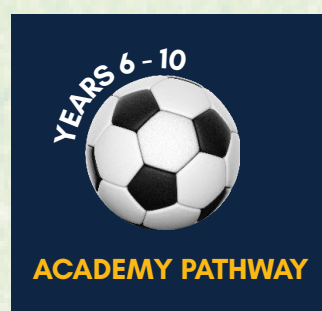
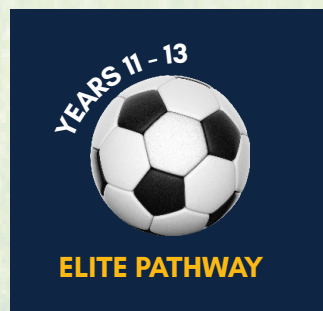
The Tettenhall College International Football Academy

in global partnership with Wolverhampton Wanderers FC

The Tettenhall College International Football Academy is an outstanding opportunity for day and boarding pupils to combine an excellent academic programme with a high-level football pathway.

The Academy is designed for aspiring and ambitious players aged 7 – 18, both boys and girls, who are serious about their game and about their education. The school provides a fully integrated footballing programme that does not compromise the academic endeavours of the pupil. Both are of significant importance.

The following pathways are available for aspiring and ambitious players:



ACADEMY PATHWAY

YEARS 6 – 10 (AGES 10 – 15)

At Tettenhall College, the Academy Pathway lays the foundation for future success – blending technical development, tactical understanding, a focus on personal fitness, and a strong academic core. Our senior school programme provides a high-performance football environment, designed to mirror professional academy standards.

Delivered by UEFA-qualified coaches, following an advanced professional development syllabus:

- Two after-school training sessions per week
- Weekly school time training with Wolves coaches (2 hours per week)
- Regular competitive fixtures, including:
 - Midweek school games against independent schools
 - Entry into ISFA competitions
 - Friendlies against visiting national and international opposition
- Enhanced player development opportunities
- Access to football academy guest speakers and masterclass sessions
- Match analysis and performance review
- Individual Learning Plan (ILP) programme tailored to each player
- Opportunities to attend Wolves FC fixtures during the season

ELITE PATHWAY

YEARS 11 – 13 (AGES 15 – 19)

From Year 11 at Tettenhall College, pupils step up into the Elite Pathway and begin a three year journey that combines high-level football development with an outstanding education. Be part of the Wolves FC family and philosophy.

Each player follows a personalised training schedule, averaging 12 hours of high intensity coaching, training and fitness development each week. Along side this, there is a comprehensive schedule of league and friendly fixtures, all designed to challenge, elevate and prepare an athlete for the next level of performance.

- **High Intensity Technical Sessions with Wolves FC & All Stars coaches each week** – focused on individual development, typically leading up to a game
- **Tactical sessions with Wolves FC and All Stars coaches each week** – the day before a match centred on squad preparation and game plans
- **Recovery sessions** – lighter, low-intensity work the day after a game
- **Training sessions at Wolves Training Ground, Compton Park**
- **One to two Match Days per week** – a combination of league competitions and arranged friendlies.
 - Game Days: Wednesday and Saturday (typically)
 - There will be additional match opportunities through the season against professional academy sides across the region and international touring teams.
- **Opportunities to attend Wolves FC fixtures** during the season
- **Personalised strength & conditioning sessions**
- **Professional sports psychology** visualisation and goal setting
- **Wider exposure to football and the business of football** through sessions with Wolves FC representatives
- Wear the International Football Academy kit

Physical development

Players benefit from physical appraisal sessions at suitable intervals through the season, along with termly squad fitness assessments. Each player has their own Individual Action Plan, built around the Four Corner Model – covering the Physical, Psychological, Technical and Tactical elements of their game.

Performance support

Performance analysis sits at the heart of what we do. When it is paired with a personalised action plan, it becomes a really powerful tool – helping players pinpoint the specific areas of their game, that, when improved, make a tangible difference to their contribution within the team. In order to support the development process, each match will be filmed and reviewed, in order to support each player's Individual Action Plan. In support of this, players have access to physiotherapy, sports therapy, strength and conditioning, sports psychology, performance analysis and special player menu (nutrition for body and mind).

How to Apply for a Place at TC



APPLICATION

Complete the registration form and return this to the Admissions Team, together with the student's passport, parent's passport, most recent school reports/ transcripts, and any relevant examination results. A registration fee of £175 is payable at this time.



INTERVIEW AND ASSESSMENT

The student and their parent(s) are invited to attend an online or in-person meeting with the Admissions Team to learn more about each other and to address any questions they may have. This meeting forms the interview part of the application process. If joining for one year or more, the student will then be required to complete an online academic assessment (CAT4).



APPLICATION REVIEW

Assessment results (if applicable) are reviewed alongside school reports, interview notes and supporting documentation.



OFFER OF PLACE

The Headmaster will decide if a place is to be offered, based on the overall assessment information. An offer letter and acceptance form will be sent to the parents of the student.



ACCEPTANCE AND DEPOSIT

To accept the place, a signed acceptance form must be sent to the Admissions Team. The acceptance deposit is paid at this time. A Joining Pack is sent to the family. The joining forms must be fully completed and returned, prior to the student's arrival at school.



VISA PROCESS

Where a visa is required, the Admissions Team will share the family's details with the school's visa consultants. They will then contact the family to begin the visa process. The first term's fees must be paid in full, prior to a CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) being issued. Families must also have evidence of cash funds for the balance of the annual fees.



VISA APPROVAL

Once approved, families must share the visa details with the school, including the eVisa share code.



TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

Flights are booked by the family, who must inform the school of travel details. Airport transfers can be arranged by the school upon request (costs covered by the family).



ARRIVAL AND INDUCTION AT TETTENHALL COLLEGE

When the child arrives to school, they will be welcomed by the Boarding Team. If starting in September for the start of the school year, they will be asked to arrive for Boarders' Arrival Day. A buddy is assigned to help new students settle into school and boarding life.

Students with a UK visa will be covered for treatment on the National Health Service via the International Health Surcharge (IHS).

If a student does not have a UK visa, they should have comprehensive travel insurance, that includes health coverage.

WEEKEND OUTINGS & SCHOOL TRIPS

Boarders' weekend outings are typically around £20 - 40, however information is available before booking. A brochure of school trips & prices is available.



CHARGEABLE ACTIVITIES (OPTIONAL)

We offer a small number of additional off-site activities, which attract an additional charge. These currently include: Horse Riding, Indoor Tennis, Golf and Climbing.



Individual instrumental or vocal music lessons are charged on an hourly basis.

School Holidays & Guardianship

During each academic year, there are three main holidays (end of term), and three short (mid-term) holidays. We do not have exeat weekends.

They are:

- October half term 2 weeks
- Christmas 3 weeks
- February half term 1 week
- Easter 2 weeks
- May half term 1 week
- Summer



If a student would like to stay at school for the October, February or May half term breaks (not Easter or Christmas) they are welcome to do so, for a small additional charge.

During the holiday period, most students will either return home or spend time with their Guardians.

There will also be opportunities for students to take part in school trips which often take place during holiday periods. These range from language trips in Europe to sports trips, music trips or perhaps geography, business or art trips around the world.

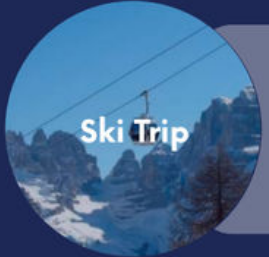

Important information about Guardianship

A UK guardian is required for all boarding students, irrespective of age, whose parents live overseas, have a guardian who resides in the UK. This guardian must be appointed by the parents.

What does an Educational Guardian do?

Educational Guardianship is much more than providing a student with a place to stay when they are not in school – it's about safeguarding a young person's welfare and enabling them to flourish in the UK's education system. With the right Guardian in place, parents can be confident their child is supported, understood, and cared for every step of the way. An accredited Guardianship organisation handles various responsibilities for families:

Accommodation and care

Arranging for the child to stay with a safe and comfortable host family during school holidays or exets – a real 'home away from home'

Travel arrangements

Making sure the child gets to where they need to be when they need to be there.

Emergency contact for schools

In case of illness, accidents, or disciplinary matters, and being proactive in getting issues sorted quickly.

Communicating updates

Keeping parents informed about a child's progress, school reports and parent meetings.

Pastoral and practical support

A familiar face, emotional reassurance, and advice when a student is adjusting to life away from home. Practical support with things like accessing the NHS, opening bank accounts, obtaining UK SIM cards, shopping for uniform, and even managing pocket money.

Why do international families need an Educational Guardian?

UK boarding schools insist that all overseas students have a UK based Guardian. This helps schools to stay compliant with UK Visas and Immigration, and to adhere to safeguarding standards within the National Minimum Standards for Boarding.

Is the host family the same as the Guardian?

In short, no! The two roles are often confused by international families new to the UK education system. Both play an important role in a student's well-being, however, their responsibilities and relationship with the student are quite different.

What is a host family?

A host family provides temporary accommodation and care for a student when they are not staying at school, for example, during exeat weekends or half-terms. A host family offers a home environment – a place to relax, enjoy family life, and experience British culture first-hand.

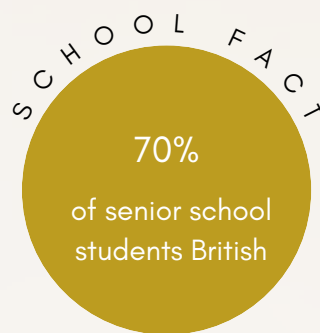
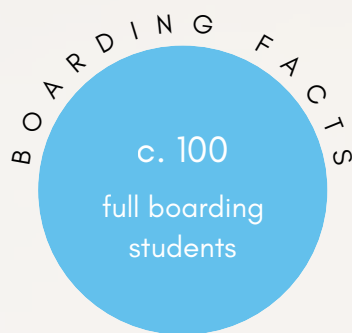


STUDIES

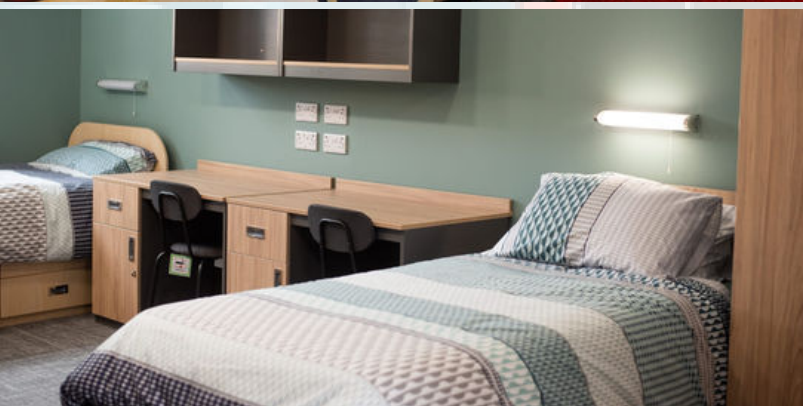


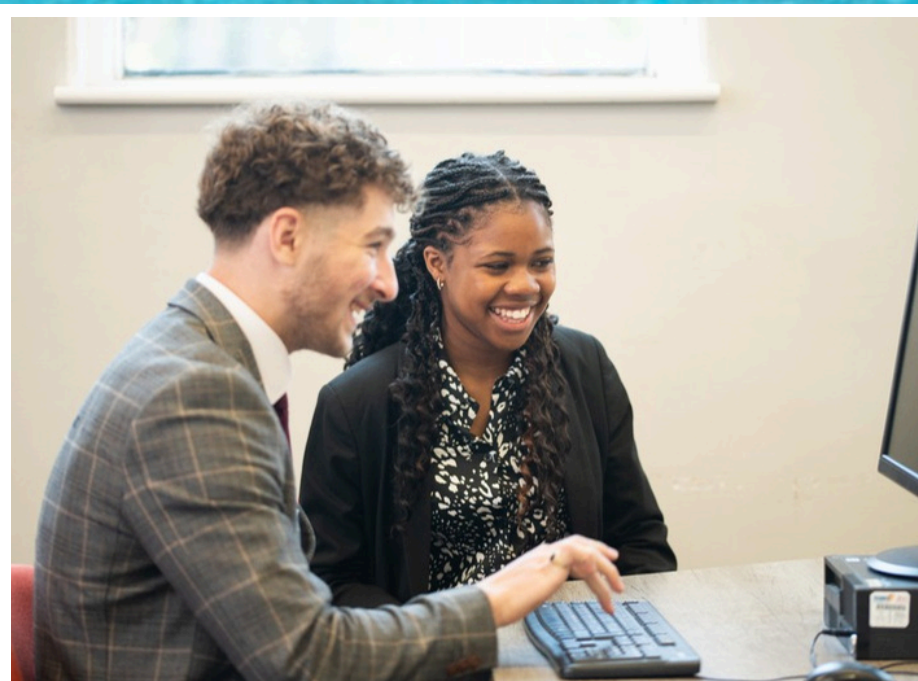


Our three boarding houses offer modern, comfortable accommodation, with bedroom areas divided for boys and girls, but with social areas open for everyone to mix together.

Junior boarders, typically aged 10 – 14 years old, share their bedrooms, usually as a group of three, but with a maximum of four. Our rooms are warm and inviting bedrooms, as opposed to bigger 'dormitories'. These rooms have shared bathrooms, which are modern, fresh and designed to ensure a student has good privacy. A series of new bedrooms were completed recently, delivering typically triple rooms which have ensuite facilities. These are usually available for students aged around 13 – 15 years.

Students aged between 15 – 17 years will typically share a twin room with one other student. Where possible, we will make sure that the other student is of a different nationality or language group. The majority of our twin rooms are en-suite. Our most senior students are offered single study bedrooms, very similar to those you might find in good quality university accommodation.
