These charges are voluntary. If you are unable or unwilling to pay them, please speak to your Room Lead, who will provide you with more information on alternatives and our packed lunch policy.

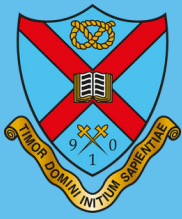

Term funding: key dates*

Term	Deadline to submit code to nursery	Funding begins
Autumn	1st July	1st September
Spring	30th November	1st January
Summer	28th February	1st April (dependant on Easter)

*Please note that you must give your code to us before the deadline date to ensure that the funding is applied to your invoice. HMRC dates are as follows: 31st December | 31st March | 31st August.
If codes are not received by the deadline date, you will be responsible for paying the invoice in full.

Who is eligible for 15 hours funding?

All 3 to 4-year-olds in England are eligible for 570 funded hours per year until the term in which they start Reception or reach compulsory school age (the term following their 5th birthday).

There are no earning or work requirements. Working parents with children aged 2-4 year-olds may be eligible for an additional 15 hours. Check your eligibility on the Best Start in Life website.

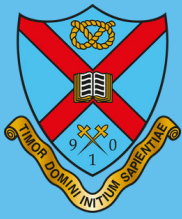
15 hours funding can be used in blocks of 5 hours:

- 8am-1pm
- or
- 1pm-6pm

15 hours funding

When accessing your 15 hours funding this can only be used at Tettenhall College.

15-hour funding may also be available for two-year-olds of families in receipt of additional support (FRAS)



Who is eligible for 30 hours funding?

All eligible working parents of children aged 9 months to 3-4 years can access 30 hours of funded hours childcare during term time

Eligibility can be checked on the Best Start in Life website.

30 hours funding

When accessing your full entitlement, a maximum of 6 hours per day for 30-hour funded children will be applied in any one day (see chart to the right-hand side).

When accessing your 30 hours funding this can only be used at Tettenhall College.

Funding will be allocated to afternoon sessions (12pm-6pm)

For full days, parents must pay the remaining 4 hours.

Funded only options are available. These can be accessed as 6 hours per day of funding, during term time. See below example:

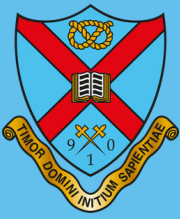

Discounts

We offer a sibling discount if there are no funded hours.

There are no discounts for those accessing funding hours.



Booking patterns

We recommend your child should attend a booking pattern of 2 1/2 days or more to ensure your child settles at nursery.



*Registration fee

A registration fee is not charged for fully funded places. It applies on every other application. The registration fee is also applicable to re-applications after leaving the nursery.



** The deposit payment is only refundable after a child enrolls as a pupil in the Tettenhall College Preparatory School Reception class.

Nursery Admissions Criteria (Oversubscription Policy)

(Aligned with City of Wolverhampton Local Authority Guidance)

Looked After and Previously Looked After Children

Highest priority will be given to children who are looked after or were previously looked after children. A 'looked after child' is a child who is in the care of a local authority or is being provided with accommodation by a local authority. Previously looked after children are those who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted, subject to a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order.

Siblings

Priority will be given to children who have a sibling on roll at the school at the time of admission.

For the purpose of this policy, a sibling is defined as:

- A brother or sister
- A half-brother or half-sister
- A step-brother or step-sister
- A child living permanently at the same address as part of the same family unit

Full Fee-Paying Applicants

Priority will next be given to children whose parents/carers have confirmed that they will take up a full fee-paying place (either fully non-funded hours or additional paid provision beyond funded entitlement).

Distance from the Nursery

Priority will then be given to children living closest to the nursery.

- Distance will be measured in a straight line from the child's permanent home address to the main entrance of the nursery
- Measurements will be carried out using the Local Authority's approved geographical information system (GIS)

Tie-breaker

In the event that two or more applicants meet the same criterion and live the same distance from the nursery, places will be allocated by random selection, supervised by an independent person.

Waiting List

A waiting list will be maintained and ranked according to the above criteria. It will not operate on a first-come, first-served basis.

General Principles

- All applications will be treated fairly and in line with equalities legislation
- The nursery operates in line with the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)
- Parents may be required to provide proof of address
- A nursery place does not guarantee a place in Reception

Additional Statement

Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming the setting will be admitted before the application of oversubscription criteria.
